Purpose:

The College of Education and Human Development (CEHD) Associate Dean of Research and Faculty Development (ADRFD) welcomes faculty interest in participating in the National Center for Faculty Development and Diversity (NCFDD) [Faculty Success Program](#).

The NCFDD Faculty Success Program is a 12-week opportunity that pairs faculty with a tenured faculty coach, access to master coaching sessions, weekly training, and a supportive community to increase their research/creative activity productivity. It is intended for faculty who want and/or are being encouraged to:

- Set achievable professional and personal goals and a realistic plan to meet them
- Establish a consistent and sustainable daily writing routine
- Develop a publication profile that exceeds the institution's promotion criteria
- Master best practices in academic time management
- Excel at collaborating effectively with colleagues and administrators

The program participants meet once a week with a small group of faculty at your same rank and with a faculty coach. The small group is made up of faculty from different universities.

Award Amount:

- The faculty success program costs approximately \$4,550 per participant. Subject to the CEHD budget, we anticipate sending one CEHD faculty member in fall and spring annually.

Timeline: (recurring annually)

- Annual deadline for applications: September 1
- Recipients announced: Approximately 2 weeks after deadline

Application and Review:

Interested faculty should contact the ADRFD with a brief explanation of their interest and rationale for participation. There is no formal application. Participants will be selected by the ADRFD in consultation with department chairs and the Dean.
